

Andy's rules for hard or soft g at end of word

Hard g if:

<vowel> = a, e, i, o, u, å, ä, ö AND y

word in base form ends in <vowel>g
word in base form ends in <vowel>gg
word in base form ends in <vowel>ng

Examples:

Företag (company)

Hög (high, heap)

Lägg (lay/place, leg)

Krog (restaurant/bar)

Blyg (shy)

dag(ar) (day/s)

väg(ar) (road, way)

vägg (wall)

tidning(ar) (newspaper/s)

väldig(t) (enormous/huge/very)

Soft g otherwise:

Examples:

Borg (fortress/castle)

Färg (colour)

Älg (elk/moose)

Arg (angry)

exceptions: mig, dig, sig ('may', 'day', 'say')

if you are unsure then guess at hard g
