It	Den/det 'Den' goes with nouns that have 'en' and 'det' goes with nouns that have 'ett' If referring without an 'en' or 'ett' such as the time e.g. 'it is late' you would use 'det'. 'Det Är sent' - it is late. You do not pronounce the 't' do in speech 'det' becomes 'de')	it	den/det (depending on the noun's gender (en/ett))	it (itself)	sig (sjÄlv)
